## Attendance - Important Changes

# IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE LAW REGARDING PENALTY NOTICES FOR UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

A new National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence, including unauthorised holiday absence, is being introduced following changes to the law. These new Government regulations will come into effect from 19 August 2024 and will affect when penalty notices are issued in Cornwall.

### What are the changes?

- 1. There will be a new national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for when a penalty notice must be considered.
- 2. The new rules mean you will no longer be able to take your child out of school for one week's holiday without the consideration of a penalty notice being issued.

- 3. There will be an increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.
- 4. If a second penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.
- 5. If a parent then commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will need to consider other enforcement options available to them. This could include prosecution.

Please see FAQs below with more information about how the new rules may affect you.

We would like to thank parents and carers for their support in making sure that children do not miss any valuable learning time.

#### **FAQs**

If I have been issued with a penalty notice before 19 August 2024, will this be counted if I am issued with another penalty notice from September onwards?

No, the new limits come into effect from 19 August 2024.

## If I have already booked a holiday for next year, could I receive a penalty fine at the new higher rate?

Yes, if the absence has not been authorised by the Head Teacher of your child's school. Remember, only a Head Teacher can agree whether an absence can be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

#### Who can be issued with a penalty notice?

- Each parent can receive a fine for each child who has had unauthorised absence from school.
- In education law, anyone who lives with a child and who has day-to-day care of the child is also considered to be a parent whether they are the biological parent or not. This will include stepparents and partners.

#### Do the new rules only apply to holidays during term time?

No, it applies to all unauthorised absence from school including holidays. Unauthorised absence
includes other absence that has not been agreed such as truancy, arriving late after the register
has closed and failing to provide reasons for absence.

#### How do I request for my child to have leave granted during term time?

You must submit an Exceptional Circumstances / Absence Request form before the proposed
absence (see your school's policy for the expectation of the number of days before the proposed
leave date by which school must have received the form). It will be for your child's Head Teacher
to make a decision as to whether there are exceptional circumstances that will allow them to
grant the time off. Do not assume that the absence will be granted until you have received
confirmation from the school.

# Do the 10 sessions of unauthorised absence have to be taken all at the same time before a penalty fine is issued?

No, a penalty fine can be issued for any combination of absences over a 10-week rolling period. They can be consecutive or non-consecutive and can span over two terms (including between academic years).

## What happens if I am issued with a penalty fine and I don't pay it?

Unauthorised absence from school is an offence under S444 of the Education Act 1996. A penalty fine is an opportunity for you to settle out of court. If you don't take this opportunity, you can be prosecuted for the offence of failing to ensure your child's regular attendance.

### What should I do if I am worried about my child's attendance?

In the first instance you should contact your child's school (Mrs King) and ask for advice on how they can support you to improve the situation.

## School Uniform

Below is a brief reminder of our school uniform expectations. Please can you support your child by ensuring they are in the correct uniform every day.

# Please note that from January 2024, our policy will state 'plain socks' (no logos) for the reasons stated below.

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- · engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart
- identifies the children with the school
- is not distracting in class
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents
- has been designed with health and safety in mind

#### **School Uniform:**

- Red school jumper, a red cardigan or red school fleece (available from the school office)
- White polo shirt
- Suitable outdoor coat or anorak
- During the summer months, please ensure your child attends school with a suitable summer hat. It is recommended, to avoid sunstroke, that they wear one with a back neck cover.
- Jewellery and visible body piercing are not permitted in school for reasons of loss, damage and safety. One pair of earrings, which are small studs and a wristwatch, may be worn.
- We ask that all hair that can be, is appropriately tied back and natural looking (no extreme colours or styles). We ask that novelty hair accessories are kept for non-school uniform days and all headbands are flat and in the school colours (black, red or white please).
- No make up is allowed in school.
- No skinny trousers or black jeans may be worn
- Footwear Black sensible functional shoes No flashing lights. All black shoes/boots or all black trainers with black laces and soles (toes must be covered for health and safety reasons)
- Socks/tights must be plain and black, grey or white in colour (red tights are also permissible)
- Black or grey trousers/culottes/skirts/dresses/shorts (just above the knee)
- Red/white summer dresses (just above the knee)

# All children may wear their school PE kit on for the whole day when they have a PE lesson or an after school PE club.

- The school black PE shirt (available from the school office) or a plain white t-shirt
- A pair of black shorts and, during the winter months all black trousers/tracksuit bottoms can be worn.
- A pair of trainers (not plimsolls)

Pre-loved quality uniform is available to parents via the office and every Friday via our FOSMS pre-loved uniform shop.

## Outdoor Learning - Wild Tribe



Outdoor learning is really important to us at St Merryn School and we are continually improving our outdoor curriculum for our pupils.

This year, Children will be having **weekly Wild Tribe Sessions** with their classes. Their learning will cover outdoor forest school type skills which are linked to the National Curriculum. They may be outside learning maths, art, design and technology, science, Religious education, history, geography or literacy. As part of the children's learning during Wild Tribe sessions, they will accessing our wider curriculum through activities such as; making fires, cooking, mud sculptures, tree climbing, using tools to whittle wood and saw wood to make objects. Just as for PE sessions, it is vital that children have the correct clothing to do these activities. As we move forward into the colder wetter months of the year, it's really important children have appropriate clothing to enable our outdoor activities. On your child's 'Wild Tribe Day, they will need to come to school in their school uniform, however they will need to bring long leggings/trousers, long sleeved tops and either wellies or old trainers depending on weather to put on over their uniform or change into. Please be aware these closes are likely to get dirty and smoky as well as potentially accidentally damaged during activities. In wet/cold weather, children will need

waterproof jackets, warm layers and wellies that they can bring to school. If you are unsure about any clothing requirements, please see you child's class teacher or myself.



## Reading for Pleasure


We hope that everyone enjoyed the summer holidays and had plenty of opportunities to read some exciting new books or enjoy rereading your favourites!


## **Inclusion Update...Information for Parents**

As we begin this new academic year, I (Mrs Golay) will be covering the role of SENCO until Mrs Bateman returns. I am really looking forward to having the opportunity to work closely with our families to support our children to achieve their full potential both in school and at home. Miss Eke will be supporting me in this role as our Operational SENCO, she will be holding a number of informal parent café sessions throughout the year where you will be able to come into school and discuss any needs or questions you might have regarding your child's development and education – the dates for these sessions will follow. Please do not hesitate to find either of us if you would like to ask any questions or arrange a meeting.

In addition to this, we are very lucky to still have the support of our **Mental Health Practitioner – Kirsty Battison**. ## Safeguarding - Online Safety



### Parent's Guide: Top Tips for Navigating Generative AI Safely with Kids

What Is Generative AI? Generative AI is a tool that can create text, images or even videos based on the input it receives. Some types of generative AI include:

- Large language models that can be used to create essays, poems and reports, based on specific instructions
- Chatbots and virtual assistants that can provide human-like conversations and online assistance.
- Image generators that create art work or photographic images based on a set of instructions.
- Video synthesis, where generative AI creates animations and video content.

#### What's My Role as a Parent?

## **Explain and Educate**

Generative AI, as with many new technologies, is here to stay and the likelihood is that your child will be using it. Spend time talking about generative AI tools with them and making sure that they understand the technology and know about the positives and negatives.

## **Share and Explore**

Investigate generative AI with your child so that both of you know what it can do. Try out some fun tasks together. Use a large language model tool to write a funny story based on five random words. Or why not ask the model to write a poem or a song based on an unusual topic, such as chips or flying cats?

## Supervision

Set ground rules for using AI, just as you would with any other online technology. Your child should know that they can only use generative AI when a trusted adult is around. It's also a good idea to check whatever content they produce before they share it with others.

### **Computers Aren't Perfect**

Remind your child that although computers can do some jobs quicker and more efficiently than humans and that they can be used to solve complex problems, computers aren't always right. Teach your child to question what they are told by generative AI and to double-check facts using other sources of information. Although, in this digital age, we all need to exercise a degree of caution, there is plenty of scope for children, and adults, to make use of generative AI in a safe way. Have fun exploring this new technology with your children, sharing viewpoints and discussing ideas.


