Safeguarding - Safer Internet Day 2025



Safer Internet Day 2025 will take place on the 11th of February 2025, with celebrations and learning based around the theme 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online' .Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety. Each year it

covers an online issue or theme that speaks about the things young people are seeing and experiencing online. Created in consultation with young people across the UK, this year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on the issue of scams online and for young people, how to protect themselves and others, as well as what support is available to them.

We will collaborate our thinking around this theme in a whole school assembly and each class will take part in some activities including how might it feel for somebody to be scammed, three signs to look out for if somebody thinks they're being scammed and how to protect online profiles for scammers.

# Inclusion - Early Help

### What is the 'Early Help HUB' and how can you access support?

The Early Help Hub is the 'front door' to Early Help services led by Cornwall Council and Cornwall Foundation Trust for Children and young people who are aged pre-birth to 18. If a young person has a special educational need or disability, who have a need for early help care and support, this is extended up to age 25.

### What services do they offer?

As the front door for services for children and young people in Cornwall, Professionals can request early help via an Early Help Request Form which is accessed online, Parents can also submit a request through the parent portal.

### Parents and/or professionals can request:

- Child and Adolescent Mental Health
- Early Support Supporting Change in Partnership (SCIP)
- Early Years Service
- Family Support
- Health Visiting
- Parenting Support
- Portage
- School Nursing
- Targeted Youth Support (13 years of age and above)




